Books chosen were Leaving Time by Jodi Picoult comparing human grief over loved ones to elephants, The Lincoln Highway by Amor Towles about three 18-year-olds from a juvenile detention farm in Kansas plus an 8-year-old Billy who is a younger brother to one of them. The Children Act by Ian McEwan refers to the 1989 Children Act and was made into a film by Richard Eyre and a screen play by the author starring Emma Thompson and Stanley Tucci. Paris Echo by Sebastian Faulkes while beautifully written had different timelines which was confusing and used questionable devices to manage the plot. Other books discussed were an American whodunnit Where the Crawdads Sing by Delia Owens about an abandoned girl of seven who raises herself to adulthood in North Carolina and is the prime suspect for a murder; this too was made into a film. Finally, The Goldfinch by Donna Tartt is a coming-of-age tale told by a 13-year-old boy.

In April Gary Dawson will talk on "An important new Carnian outcrop - Charles Moore's fossils to Triassic climate change". This concerns a new outcrop found in road construction near J25 of the M5 during late 2020. It turned out to be the probable, and previously unknown, location of fossils described by the Victorian geologist Charles Moore in 1867. An unusual wet period during predominantly dry Triassic times.

LITERARY STUDIES GROUP

Tue 16th April - Imperial Hotel 2.30pm Tue 21st May – Imperial Hotel 2.30pm Our last book, written in 1974, was If Beale Street Could Talk by James Baldwin - a leading

civil rights activist. This was a powerful story of love in an atmosphere of severe and extreme social and racial injustice, which most agreed, was cleverly written, even though the structure was unfamiliar. However, it was not enjoyed by all. For some, it gave an interesting view of black society, in particular that of a family faced with undeniably corrupt and racist individuals and institutions. For others, it was just not an enjoyable read. The author embedded some positive underlying messages of optimism, sisterhood and family loyalty, but he also conveyed messages of despair and racial injustice which seemed to outweigh the lighter moments. This was a seriously emotive subject with the potential for a powerful novel, but it lacked substance, making it difficult to engage with the characters. The one thing that we did agree on was that the ending was inconclusive and therefore disappointing.
